(TEP Culture and Education Association)

TEP Culture and Education Association, established in 2010, is an NGO (Non-Governmental Organization) from Taiwan dedicated to youth education, employment promotion and agriculture cooperation in Southeast Asia.

2. Policy and Governance

- Rural Education as Top Priority :
To offer free education where it is most needed.
- Employment and Agriculture Cooperation :
To prepare youth for future careers.
- Efficient Source Utilization :
No paid staff and rented office in Taiwan.
No house and fixed assets in Cambodia.
- Financial Transparency :
Quarterly reports to be published online.

3. Education Goals

- To Narrow Digital Gap

Practical computer skills are taught to narrow the digital gap among children, with computers from Taiwan, the world's leader in computer manufacturing.

- To Eliminate Foreign-Language Illiteracy

Various courses of English, as a global lingua franca, are offered to develop the second-language literacy and to expand access to higher education.

4. Employment Goals

- To offer vocational training and guidance to villagers in rural areas where agriculture technology and irrigation infrastructure are lacking.
- To assist migrant workers returning home from Thailand and to find factory and farming jobs in their own countries.
- To provide opportunities for rural government officials to visit and gain access to multi-national companies operating in Cambodia.

5. Agriculture Goals

- To enhance the agricultural cooperation between Taiwan and Cambodia by facilitating exchange visits of Government officials and agricultural professionals for study, training and exhibition.
- To increase agriculture productivity and improve farmers' livelihood by promoting technology transfer, trade and between Taiwan and Cambodia.

Achievements in Cambodia

- Education : 35 learning centers have been established with 39,000 students enrolled and 25,000 graduated since 2010. From 2019 onward, 5,000 students will graduate yearly.
- Employment : Some 1,000 workers have found jobs with the help of CTEP since 2015. 400 more jobs will be placed every year.
- Agriculture Cooperation: 33 Cambodians were invited to Taiwan for visits, trainings or exhibitions in 2018. Additional 100 agricultural professionals will visit Taiwan in 2 years.

1. CTEP Education





1.1 Education Development Model

- Training : Rural trainees are given intensive training to be seed teachers.
- Teaching : Seed teachers, after completing training, return to their villages to teach with pay, computers, and teaching materials provided by CTEP.
- Retaining : Teachers join on-the-job training twice a month.
- Evaluation : Counselors are regularly dispatched by CTEP to villages for evaluation as well as guidance.

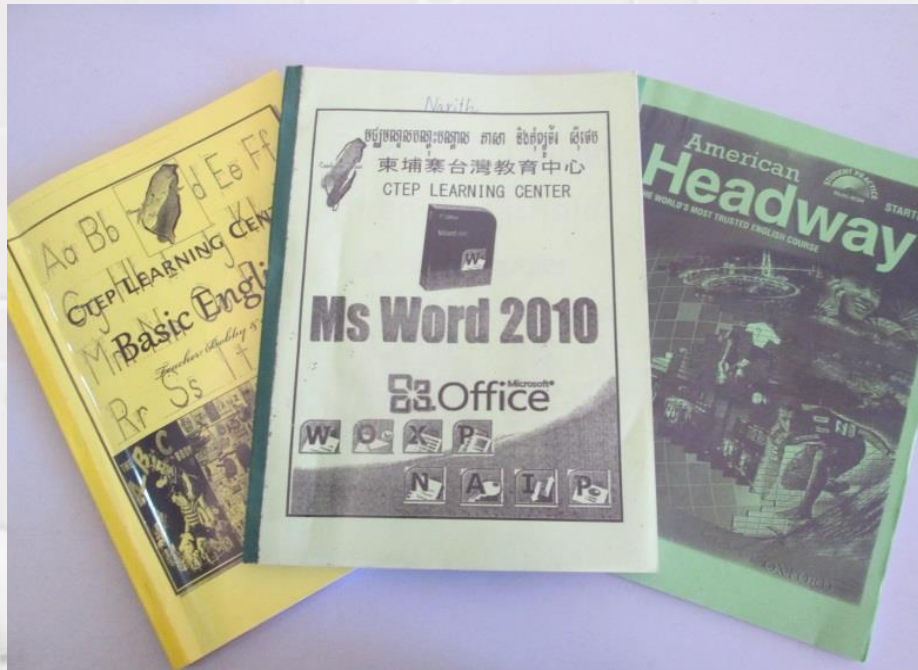

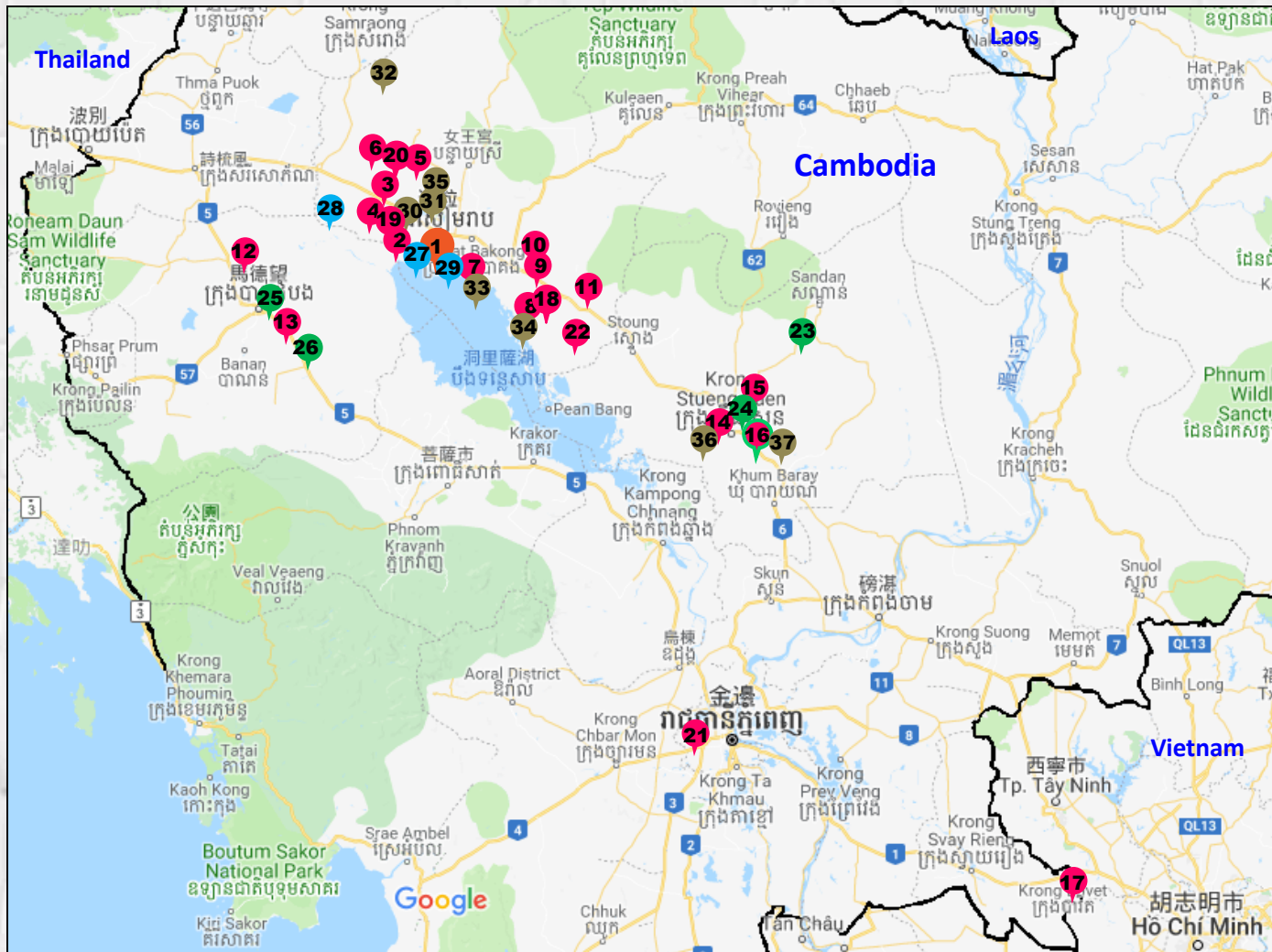


1.5 CTEP Learning Centers

- Graduation Requirements :
To receive Graduation Certificate, a student must attend English or Computer Classes 1~2 hours a day, 5 days a week, 12~16 weeks in a term.
- Achievements : 35 learning centers have been established, of which 22 remain in operation.

III. VTEP (Vietnam TEP) Vietnam-Taiwan Education Program



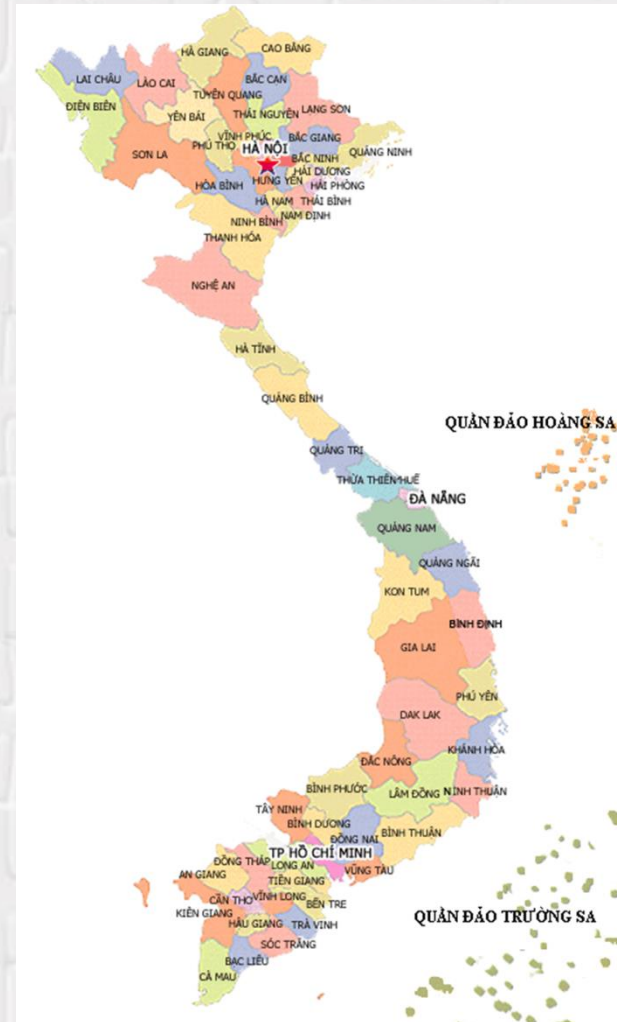
1. Vietnam Education
